Vortrag Gabriella Mazzon: Pathos as Rhetorical Strategy in Drama and Art of the Middle Ages

Pathos was a common instrument of public communication in the Middle Ages, an era in which emotion-based rhetoric superseded other strategies of influencing and instructing the populace. Gabriella Mazzon asserts that verbal and visual elements are often employed in tandem to impress the public and to aid the memory. These new communication types were particularly prevalent in the later centuries of the Middle Ages, when new mendicant monastic orders introduced novel methods of preaching.
