Foucault and Agamben: Criticism as a Form of Life

PROJECT-DESCRIPTION

Alessia Ricciardi is currently at work on a third book project entitled *Foucault and Agamben: Criticism as a Form of Life*. The analysis focuses on how Michel Foucault and a specific genealogy of Italian critics, preeminently represented by Giorgio Agamben, position the concept of a form of life at the

center of their critiques of social institutions. In what ways can we say that Foucault and Agamben continue the tradition of their predecessors? In what ways do they transform it? Ricciardi examines how the two theorists and their interlocutors respond to these questions in order to assess their different modes of political engagement. Ricciardi's essays have appeared in *PMLA*, *Modernism/Modernity*, *Modern Language Notes*, *Diacritics*, and *The Romanic Review*, among other publications. Her most recent articles are about works by Pasolini, Foucault, Deleuze, and Agamben.
